

Common poisons in cats

Paracetamol.

This drug is an anti-inflammatory, used to treat pain or reduce fevers. People commonly take it for headache, or when they have a cold. In some countries it is known as acetominophen.

In cats the poison affects the ability of the red blood cells to carry oxygen. The toxic level is as little as one tablet per cat. There is an antidote but it must be given intravenously before the cat suffers irreparable damage and dies.

In Sydney paracetamol is commonly found in Panadol, Panadeine, Panadol osteo,

Vet Notes N-acetylcystine 140mg/kg IV then 70mg/kg PO q6 for 7 treatments; ascorbic acid 30mg/kg PO or SC; emergency conversion of methemaglobin to hemaglobin with methylene blue 1-2mg/kg IV; for Heinz bodies Cimetadine 10mg/kg IV, IM, PO q6-8.
